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Groupings are used to identify areas of ischemia, injury, or infarct on a 12 lead EKG.

Remember the groups!!

- Keep it simple
- Knowing the groups identifies where in the heart ischemia, injury, or infarct has occurred

MNEMONIC (LISA)

What are we looking for ?

- ST/J point elevation, depression within the groups.
- Tall peaked, flat, or inverted T waves.
- 2 mm or more in 2 or more contiguous or anatomically connected leads.
